AGO Workshop – Learning Without Tears April 5, 2014 at 9:30 AM First Parish Church, Saco

Our April 5th meeting changed because of the opportunity to feature Helyn Connerr, an internationally known author, as our speaker. Ms. Connerr, a resident of New Hampshire and UK, will present a workshop on different learning styles based on her book, Learning Without Tears: Identify a Child's Unique Learning Style; Unlock a Child's True Potential.

Helyn Connerr has developed an entirely original system, known as the Mercury Model. Sympathetic and lighthearted in tone, the Mercury Model is designed as a series of in-depth profiles, with 12 archetypal mental personifications that include characters like Scout, the Trailblazer; Details, the Analyst; and Sherlock, the Detective. Helyn reveals how these different learning types receive and process information.

One reviewer raves: 'This approach is a revelation in the world of education, showing that students are not just square pegs to be fitted into round holes. Ms. Connerr presents the multifaceted elements that constitute the young mind, and explains how teachers need to know the different features that make up each student. *Learning*

Without Tears should make teachers question "the tried and true" methods of indoctrination through memorization and parroting responses.'

Whether you are a learner, a teacher, a parent or grandparent, expect to have your traditional notions of the teacher-student relationship overturned!

Dudley Buck
(March 10, 1839 – October 6, 1909)
was a founding member of the AGO
and a New Englander. He was a composer, organist, and writer on music.
He published several books, most notably the *Dictionary of Musical Terms and Influence of the Organ in History*, which was published in New York in 1882. He is best known today for his organ composition, *Concert Variations on the Star-Spangled Banner, Op. 23*, which was later arranged into an orchestral version.

The AGO Portland Chapter recommends the following fees for Substitute Organists:


One service (Organist or Organist/Choir Director) \$150.00 - \$300.00

A second service essentially the same as the first service 50% of first service fee

Rehearsal (1 ½ hours maximum) \$60.00 - \$100.00

Additional rehearsals with soloists, choir or instrumentalists \$30.00 -\$100.00/hour, depending on the difficulty of music

Mileage- 55 cents/mile if visits to church for practice, rehearsal, service exceed 25 miles/round trip.
