

We are very excited about the Community Hymn Festival on Sunday, November 16 at Merrill Auditorium. This joint effort of the Portland AGO and the Friends of the Kotzschmar Organ will help celebrate the triumphant return of the Kotzschmar Organ.

Nothing can compare to the boisterous singing of hymns in festive arrangement by a large group of musicians. We are delighted that you and your choir members are planning to participate.

We anticipate 250 singers joining us in this most festive event. Many of the arrangements will include the Salvation Army New York Staff Band in addition to the organ. Several hymns will have a verse of choir alone, and several hymns will be grouped together in medleys. In order to have a very wide variety of hymns, we will not sing all verses of all hymns.

We will be using five arrangements that will require

singers to have printed copies, four of which will be the responsibility of participants to obtain:

The AGO Portland Chapter recommends the following fees for Substitute Organists:

One service (Organist or Organist/Choir Director) \$150.00 - \$300.00

A second service essentially the same as the first service 50% of first service fee

Rehearsal (1 ½ hours maximum) \$60.00 - \$100.00

Additional rehearsals with soloists, choir or instrumentalists \$30.00 -\$100.00/hour, depending on the difficulty of music

Mileage- 55 cents/mile if visits to church for practice, rehearsal, service exceed 25 miles/round trip.
