

From Harold Stover:

Dear friends,

As you are filling in your new 2014 calendars, I will be grateful if you note that I will be playing a recital on the landmark 1928 Ernest M. Skinner organ at the Cathedral Church of St. Luke on State Street on Sunday, April 27, at 3:00 PM.

The program will include two works by 20th Century French composers Marcel Dupré and Olivier Messaien. Messaien will be represented by his Chants d'Oiseaux, a remarkable work for the spring and Easter seasons consisting almost entirely of bird calls notated in the field, then transcribed for the organ.

Also on the program are my own most recent publication, a work by the Chicago composer Leo Sowerby that demonstrates many of the beautiful softer sounds of the Skinner tonal palette, and the Choral in a minor by César Franck, one of the great organ works of the Romantic era.

I send best wishes for the New Year to all of you.

Dudley Buck (March 10, 1839 – October 6, 1909) was a founding member of the AGO and a New Englander. He was a composer, organist, and writer on music. He published several books, most notably the *Dictionary of Musical Terms and Influence of the Organ in History*, which was published in New York in 1882. He is best known today for his organ composition, *Concert Variations on the Star-Spangled Banner, Op. 23*, which was later arranged into an orchestral version.

The AGO Portland Chapter recommends the following fees for Substitute Organists:

One service (Organist or Organist/Choir Director) \$150.00 - \$300.00

A second service essentially the same as the first service 50% of first service fee

Rehearsal (1 ½ hours maximum) \$60.00 - \$100.00

Additional rehearsals with soloists, choir or instrumentalists \$30.00 -\$100.00/hour, depending on the difficulty of music

Mileage- 55 cents/mile if visits to church for practice, rehearsal, service exceed 25 miles/round trip.

The 2014 Mini-Convention will again be held at First Calvary Baptist Church, at the intersection of Route 125 and Massachusetts Ave. in North Andover (same location as last year).
